Tartar Trail





In the 17th century, King Jan III Sobieski granted the lands around Sokółka and Krynki to the soldiers of the Tartar banners. Their descendants live there to this day, and tourists following the Tartar Trail can learn about their history, culture and delicious cuisine. The most important places along the trail are Kruszyniany and Bohoniki where you can find the oldest mosques in Poland and historic mizars, i.e. cemeteries. The cemeteries in both villages have been recognized as Historical Monuments, which confirms their great importance for the Polish cultural heritage.

The tour includes:

- Sokółka Regional Chamber with an interesting exposition of Tatars and St. Anthony of Padua Church (a magnificent collegiate church in the classicist style – the site of the Eucharistic miracle)
- Bohoniki visit to the mosque and a tasting of Tatar dishes at "Zajazd u Mahmeda" (kolduny, pierakaczewnik, drink)
- % Kruszyniany tour of the mosque, mizar and exhibition at the Muslim Culture Centre.
- ֎ Krynki − tour of the town − remains of synagogues, St. Anne's Church.
- Supraśl tour of the town (Supraśl Lavra, St. Trinity Church)

The trip may be cancelled in case of gathering less than 10 people.
